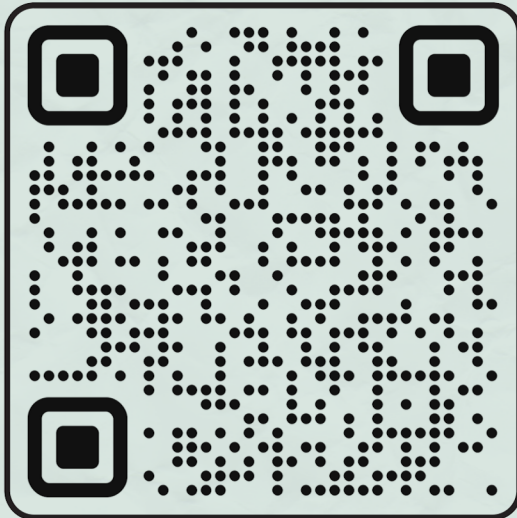


ATTENDING QUEER WEEK

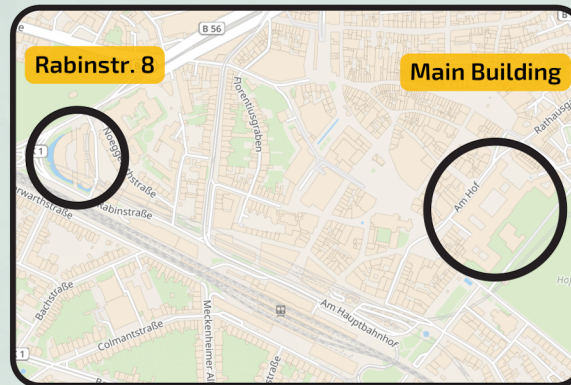

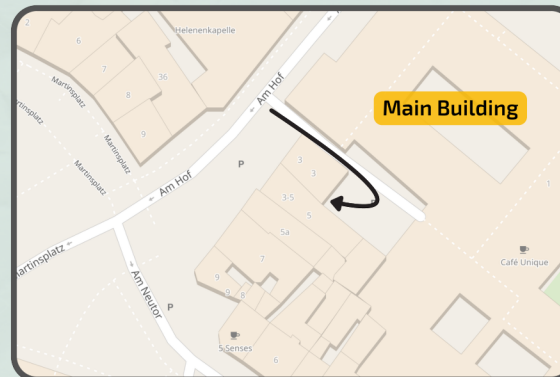


HOW TO FIND US
